You are invited to join in on the fun as we once again have our summer picnic, with an opportunity to hike or bike, in Dillon. We thank Jim and Nicki Fisher for graciously offering their home and hospitality, as they have done for many years.

For the pot luck, participants are asked to bring a dish to share, serving spoon, beverage of choice, and a lawn chair. The club will furnish meat for the main course.



<u>Bike riders and hikers will meet at 8:30 AM</u> at the Dillon Reservoir recreation parking lot. Social members and guests will need to sign a waiver, the day of, before participating in hiking or biking.

<u>Bikers: At 9:00 AM sharp, all bikers will be prepared to leave the parking lot</u>. In the past we have had three different rides: a slower group riding to Keystone, the **regular** group biking to Frisco, and the faster group cycling to Montezuma with all returning to the parking lot. The availability of these rides will be dependent upon obtaining trained leaders to volunteer. Only the regular group is confirmed. All rides are on paved surfaces The essential items for participating are plenty of water, necessary items to repair a flat tire, (replacement tube), appropriate clothing for changes in the weather, and carrying ID and a medical card. The wearing of a helmet is mandatory.

<u>Hikers:</u> At 8:45 AM, hikers will leave the parking lot in cars to the Lily Pad Lake Trailhead. The hike will be a CMC A-rated easy hike lead by a certified hike leader at a casual pace. The very beautiful scenic hike is an approximate total distance of 3.6 miles with an elevation gain of 800'. Please bring plenty of water, rain gear, sunscreen, a hat, bug repellant, and wear hiking boots.

Due to limited parking at the Fisher's home, upon conclusion of hiking and biking, participants will ride share to the picnic from the Dillon Reservoir recreation parking lot. Before hiking/biking, please arrange to ride with, and put your food in the car of, someone you are hiking or biking with. All picnic participants will be expected to arrive at the picnic between 11:30 AM and noon.

Directions to Dillon Reservoir Recreation Parking:

Take I-70 to the Dillon/Silverthorne exit 205 and turn left (South) onto US 6. Follow US 6 to Swan Mountain Rd. and turn right at the light. Drive about 0.4 miles to the dirt parking lot on the right. **Meet at the east end of the lot.**



BICYCLING

RMOTHG has cycling rides on most Fridays during the summer months in the Denver area. About 20 to 30 bikers participate weekly riding on bike paths throughout the Denver, Boulder and sometimes we go west to Summit County.

We usually ride a distance of 20 to 30 miles at a speed of 10 to 12 mph in the mornings and finish with an optional lunch at a nearby restaurant. Occasionally, we'll have a leader for a slower group of riders. Watch for notification of this slower rider group in the weekly emails. Most of our trips are on paved, level bike paths. Occasionally we encounter some hills and gravel trails.

The essential items for participating are plenty of water, necessary tools to repair a flat tire (replacement tube), appropriate clothing for changes in the weather, and <u>carrying ID and a medical</u> <u>card</u>. The wearing of a helmet is mandatory.

Email notices are sent out several days prior to the excursions to describe the weekly ride and the meeting location. Both groups will start at the same time and hopefully finisher together. Most meeting times are 8:30 AM with departure at 9:00 AM.

Guests are allowed with signing of a wavier form. Guests may participate in two of our activities before joining Rocky Mountain Over The Hill Gang (RMOTHG) section and the Denver Group of CMC.
