#### SIACKPACK

1 Overnight Backpack - Easy B 3 Sisters/Alderfer Park to Elephant Butte Wednesday, Thursday, August 7, 8

We will hike through the south/east trails of 3 Sisters/Alderfer Park (a Jefferson County Open Space Park) and then leave the park to make camp. Your tents, sleeping bags will be moved by truck close to our campsite while we hike. The next day after reloading the truck we will find our way north to Elephant Butte (elevation 8,405') and back to our cars by going off trail or on little used trails (2 days total 9-10 miles).

This slackpack is for people who want to sleep out under the stars for a night but don't want to haul all their gear. These are easy hikes with nice views, so if you are not in shape yet but want to try out



# CYCLING

The biking season is in full swing. We have ridden 13 Fridays since the beginning of May with an average of almost 30 riders each week. These riders are averaging over 21 miles each week. Combining these statistics, we have ridden over 600 miles for this portion of the summer. Great job to all the riders.

We ride a variety of routes, along most of the Creeks and Rivers in the greater Denver area. Other routes include around Chatfield Reservoir, Highline Canal, Standley Lake, Boulder, Idaho Springs and Breckenridge.

Our morning rides are about 20 to 30 miles at a speed of 10 to 12 mph and finish with an optional lunch at a nearby restaurant. When available, we'll have a leader for a slower group of riders. Watch for notification of this slower rider group (Terrapins) in the weekly emails. Most of our trips are on paved, level bike paths. Occasionally we encounter some hills and gravel trails.

The essential items for participating are plenty of water, necessary tools to repair a flat tire (replacement tube), appropriate clothing for changes in the weather, and carrying ID and a medical card. Wearing a helmet is mandatory. Email notices are sent out several days prior to the excursions to describe the weekly ride and the meeting location. Most meeting times are 8:00 AM with departure at 8:30 AM.

Guests are allowed with signing of a wavier form. Guests may participate in two of our activities before joining Rocky Mountain Over The Hill Gang (RMOTHG) section and the Denver Group of CMC.

Wilderness Trekking School is a fun, comprehensive outdoor




